Professional Information:

This course has been designed as a self-access course for all those interested in learning the script and identifying the sounds of the phonology of Educated standard English. The course is designed so that non-native English speakers can achieve quite a sophisticated understanding of the basics of phonology. It is designed as a teaching aid rather than as a definitive study of phonology and, as such, sacrifices detail in favour of clarity and ease of understanding.

1- Overall Aims of Course:

This course is designed to achieve the following goals:

1. introducing student teachers (Sts) to the basic features of the phonology of English.
2. familiarizing Sts with the vowels system.
3. acquainting Sts with the differences between consonants and vowels.
4. enhancing Sts' understanding of the rules of positioning of English consonants and their impact on pronunciation.
5. defining minimal pairs in English and to show their use in different examples.
6. describing Diphthongs and cardinal vowels.

2- Intended Learning Outcomes of Course (ILOs):

A- Knowledge and Understanding: by the end of this course students will be able to:

- A-1-1. identify the sounds of English.

- A-3-1-. identify the organs of speech.
- A-1-2. list the rules governing the production of vowels.
