Abstract

This Thesis is divided into an introduction , Five chapters and conclusion.

the introduction: includes the site of Dendera city ,the history of the temple through periods, the most important Kings who added to the temple and definition of the site of the two Passage in Dendera temple.

chapter one : includes description , translation and comment on the scenes and texts of the external interface of the corridor , which includes scenes and texts of the outside lintel and The scenes and texts from outside the entrance pillars, and the texts and views from inside the door pillars .

The second chapter : include landscape and text recorded on the north wall of the corridor E'- H' , the southern wall of the corridor E'- H' , As well as scenes and texts of the ceiling , views and the texts of the rear door of the hall E ' , and thickness of the entrance .

the third chapter: contained the description, translation and commentary of the scenery and the texts of the external interface of the corridor C'-H' , which includes scenes and texts of reproach the outside, and views and the texts of pillars door from the outside of the corridor C'-H', and views and the texts of pillars door from the inside, as well as the front bottom of the lintel , and the southern wall of the corridor C'-H' , and the north wall of the corridor C'-H' .
