

## **Antiques dedicated to Sultan Ali Dinar, artistic archaeological study.**

### **Abstract**

Sultan Ali Dinar is one of the most famous sultans of Darfur, as he was the last of the rule of the Sultanate of Darfur, from the dynasty of Al Fur, he lived in “Al Fasher” city until his death in 1906 AD, and then his palace turned into a museum that includes a large number of artistic holdings which attributed to him, including a number of artifacts Which was gifted to him before and after Sultanate.

This study deals with the archaeological description, and historical Registration to examples of these gifts which founded in “Al Fasher” museum and Caliph house Museum in Omdurman, and their significance, with details of their motifs and symbols, which were linked to political, economic and social indications, the most important of which is the friendly relationship that linked the Sultan Ali Dinar and Khedive Abbas Hilmi II in Egypt, as well as, as well as England's role in the state of Ali Dinars.
