

The Dynamics of Family Interactions in Adolescent Deaf

Abstract

The deaf isn't problem for himself, but is a problem for others as well, and if these disabilities a lot of psychological and social effects on the personality of the deaf child, it also has a lot of implications on the dynamics of family interactions. this study aimed to investigate the dynamics of family interactions in some cases of adolescent deaf and their impact on the personality traits, and levels of psychological, social and family adjustment, in order to work for better understanding, a deeper, broader and more comprehensive psychological disability hearing and try to devise the best recommendations that serve this group and contribute to improving the level of psychological adjustment, social and family they have.

The study sample consisted of two cases of adolescent deaf resident in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. This study depends on using curriculum of case study in-depth by using some tools such as application of case study, scale of parental attitudes as perceived by children, & Kinetic Family Drawing Test (KFD).

The results show that there are many Clinical indicators included in the deaf Kinetic Family Drawings, which express styles of parental socializations, Psychological & social levels of adjustment, reciprocal of the Deaf family dynamic interactions, between the case and members of her family and between family members and each other.

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
