Abstract:

The Maqasid rules have great importance in the jurisprudential adaptation of calamities and developments, and understanding the purposes of legislation, its wisdom, and its secrets. One of the most important calamities that has recently befallen the entire world is the Corona calamity, and the people of knowledge - may God protect them - have addressed the jurisprudential rulings related to that calamity, and they have relied on many rules. Al-Maqasidiya in their jurisprudential adaptation of its provisions, and from here came the idea of this research, and I addressed it from two aspects:

The first theoretical aspect: I spoke in it - after introducing the Corona virus - about defining the Maqasid rules, explaining their authority, importance, and relationship with other rules, such as: fundamentalist rules, and jurisprudential rules. The second applied aspect: I talked about the applications of the Maqasid rules, explaining the application of the Maqasid rule in many jurisprudential issues related to the provisions of the Corona virus, such as: the legality of quarantine and curfews during the Corona epidemic, as well as the legality of treatment by taking Corona vaccines, and the authorization to wear protective masks in... Prayers, Hajj, Umrah and all gatherings, the temporary closure of mosques in light of the Corona pandemic, the spacing between worshipers in prayer rows, and others.
