ABSTRACT

The Five Books of Moses

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The Pentateuch consists of the first five books of the OT: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. Religious Jews believed that God revealed them to Moses at Sinai and dictated by letter, letter. They begin with world events since the beginning of creation until the death of Moses.

This study discusses the Pentateuch from linguistic and descriptive view on the level of phonological and morphological structures. From the level of phonological, the study seeks to know the Hebrew's sound units as represented by the Pentateuch also to know the functions of these sounds and their movements as it was consonant or vowels.
