



A Proposal for an Egyptian Virtual Secondary School as a mean to help expatriate students face educational problems, in light of experiments in other countries

Abstract:

The virtual school is an appropriate way to deal with scientific and technological developments. The virtual school is defined as a virtual organization that provides classes through the internet. This study aims to support the creation of a virtual school designed to help expatriate students address the educational problems they may encounter. This study used a descriptive approach. It used a questionnaire completed by a sample of administrators of secondary schools in the Arab Republic of Egypt. It also used semi-structured interviews with faculty members at the college of education, at Fayoum University and the college of graduate studies of education at Cairo University. The study led to a proposal for a virtual school for expatriate students. This proposal covered: virtual school mission and vision, acceptance criteria, study systems and communication, students' and teachers' evaluation strategies, and approaches to practical activities.
