**Human scope:**

- Students participating in BADIR program (n = 120 male and female students).

- Social Workers participating in BADIR, who supervised the implementation of the program in schools (n= 62).

### **Location of the Study:**

### **Duration of the Study:**

The study took from 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2015 till 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2015.

### **Results of the Study:**

- 1) The program has contributed in students' acquirement of skills of communication, how to form social relationships, and group work. It also helped in identifying the level of students' understanding of voluntary culture.
- 2) Identifying the obstacles confronting the effectiveness of the development program: They were defined as the following:  
"Students' poor awareness of the importance of voluntary work; lack of financial resources dedicated for the program; lack of supervisory staff responsible for the implementation of the development program; lack of cooperation by some officials from schools with the voluntary programs.
