The findings highlight that well-trained guides not only protect fragile sites but also encourage sustainable tourism practices, improving visitor experiences through effective interpretation. However, the study also identifies challenges, such as the need for continuous professional development and balancing informative tours with site preservation efforts. The research provides actionable recommendations for integrating guide training into heritage management frameworks to ensure guides possess the expertise needed to meet conservation objectives while delivering high-quality visitor experiences. Overall, this study underscores the importance of recognizing and supporting the multifaceted roles of guides in safeguarding and interpreting archaeological heritage.
