English summary

The quranic perusals are of the sciences that should be basic in the study of the classical Arabic with its phonological, morphological, and grammatical levels, there is no difference between whether the perusal is from the seven or the ten perusals, or from what is called the *SHAZZA* (odd) perusals, because all these perusals are an accurate registeration of what was going on, on the tongue of the fluent Arabs. The Shazza perusal it is not less important than the perusals of the seven or the ten readers.

I have chosen for the study one of these odd perusals, it is the perusal of Abdul Rahman Ibn Hurmuz Al A' araj El madany, who was one of the beginners who put the rules of the Arabic grammar, I have collected more than five hundred words from the sources and studied them, with special

focus on phonetical, morphological, or grammatical issues, committed to the description of the linguistic phenomena raised by the perusal.

The study falls in three chapters, preceded by a preface, and followed by a conclusion; as follows:

Preface: In which I handle the quranic perusals from the points of the pillars of the right perusal, and the criterion of the eccentricity and its development, then I introduced biography of Abdul Rahman Ibn Hurmuz.

Chapter one: The study of the phonetic phenomena, which I divided into two sections:

The First: In which I study what is concerned with consonants.

The second: In which I study what is related to vowels.

Chapter two: The study of the morphological phenomena, which I divided into three sections:

The first: The study of the Phenomena that are related to verbs.

The second: The study of the Phenomena that are related the nouns.

The third: The study of the common phenomena between nouns and verbs.

Chapter three: The study of the grammatical Phenomena such as, the subject and the predicate, the subject and its substitute, objects, exceptions, adverb, subordinates, vocative, present participle, oath, and the declension of the verb in the present tense.

The conclusion: In which I mentioned the results which I reached through the research.
