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An abstract of the thesis titled "**Aspects of Syntactic Inflections between Syntactic Structuring and Meaning in Al-Hujja Book by Abi Ali Al-Farsi (337 AH)**"

The present study addresses the syntactic inflections as mentioned by Abi Ali Al-Farsi (377 AH) in his book titled "Al-Hujja" with the aim of determining the structuring and significant aspects that Abi Ali utilized to justify his responses to these syntactic inflections along with analyzing and evaluating them.

The study falls into an introduction, a preface, three chapters and a conclusion.

The **Introduction** highlights the significance of the study and reasons behind choosing it, along with the questions, aims, approach, methodology, presentation mode, literature review and the framework.

The **Preface** presents biographical information about Abi Ali and his book "Al-Hujja" in addition to providing definitions of the study terminology, namely (inflection, response, syntactic structuring, and meaning). Also, the relationship between syntactic structuring and meaning is tackled.

The **First Chapter** is entitled "**Aspects of inflectional words between syntactic structuring and meaning**". It tackles the different aspects in inflection of nominatives, accusatives and genitives.
