

Septorhinoplasty For Correction Of Nasal Septal Deviation

ABSTRACT

Septorhinoplasty can be a challenging problem. Nasal obstruction and esthetic problems are not infrequently observed in rhinoplasty patients. This operation can be more complicated than rhinoplasty operation alone because septal cartilage and neighbor structures should be treated as well. In addition, normal anatomical shape of these structures can be disrupted by septal deviation. It is our clinical experience, however, that external rhinoplasty and Septoplasty offer significant advantages that may be critical for achieving satisfactory functional and cosmetic results. Hence, we present our approach to restoration of operated septal deviation using a surgical technique that we have developed. Our surgical method can be adaptable to variations in the septal deformity. We have followed this technique in the surgical correction of 10 patients with nasal deviations, achieving predictable, largely satisfactory outcomes.
