Abstract

Introduction: It was surprising that the prevalence of pornography addiction in our conservative religious society is increasing that is why we decided to start studying it.

Aim: Was to assess the prevalence of pornography addiction among married patients and to study the possible interaction between pornography addiction and male sexual function.

Method: The study included ٦١٦ male patients; ٢٩٣ patients complaining of sexual dysfunction (G١) and ٣٢٣ patients not complaining of sexual dysfunction (G٢).

Results: There were (٥٨.٨%) of all patients using pornography materials ({٥٢.٩%} in G١ and {٦٤.١%} in G٢). Between pornography users, (٣٢.٦%) were using pornography before marriage for masturbation and stopped using after marriage, (١٧.٧%) patients were using pornography before marriage for masturbation and continue to use after marriage, and (٨.٤%) patients start to use pornography after marriage or after development of the sexual dysfunction.

In G١, (٢٤.٦%) were using pornography before marriage for masturbation and stopped using after marriage, (١٧.٤%) patients were using pornography before marriage for masturbation and continue to use after marriage, and (١٠.٩%) patients start to use pornography after development of the sexual dysfunction. In G٢, (٣٩.٩%) patients were using pornography before marriage for masturbation and stopped using after marriage, (١٨%) patients were using pornography before marriage

for masturbation and continue to use after marriage, and (٦.٢%) patients start to use pornography after marriage.

Conclusion: Our study provided some descriptive information about the prevalence of pornography addiction in our conservative religious society.
