Voluntary work and social welfare in Yemen

A study applied to voluntary societies in Hadhramaut Governorate

Summary

The current study seeks to identify the development of voluntary work in the field of social care in Yemen, and to identify the role of volunteering in the field of social care in Hadramout Governorate and to identify the most important difficulties facing the work of voluntary societies in Hadramout governorate, which include the difficulties associated with laws and legislation, difficulties associated with funding and difficulties related to construction Institutional, capacity building and difficulties associated with coordination and communication between associations. The current study used to achieve its goals, the social survey method in the sample for workers in voluntary societies, using the questionnaire as a tool to collect data in addition to an interview guide with workers in social affairs and labor offices in the governorate. The study reached a number of important results

including

Most voluntary societies suffer from an apparent lack of funding, which weakened programs and projects and Civil societies suffer from continuous interference by government institutions

Association workers are not provided with the necessary skills training programs for social work
