Middle East Partnership Initiative (MEPI) - Civic Education Leadership Fellowship

Scholar Exchange Opportunities

SUSI- Scholar Institutes Program

Description: Scholar Institutes are designed to strengthen curricula and improved quality of teaching about the United States overseas. Participants interact with American scholars, meet with experts in their disciplines, visit civic institutions and explore the diversity and culture of the United States. Programs are offered on American Civilization, American Politics and Political Thought, Contemporary American Literature, U.S. Foreign Policy, Journalism and Media and Religious Pluralism.

Eligibility: highly-motivated and experienced professionals from institutions of higher education. Ideal candidate should be an experienced professional, whose home institution is seeking to introduce aspects of U.S. studies into its curricula, to develop new courses in the subject of the institute, to enhance and update existing courses on the United States, or to offer specialized seminars/workshops for professionals in U.S. studies areas related to the program theme.

Eligibility: Secondary-level, full-time teachers with five or more years of classroom experience in either English as a Foreign Language, Social Sciences (social studies, civics, history, or geography) or Math and Sciences

The Near East & South Asia Undergraduate Scholarship Program (NESA)

Description: NESA fosters cross-cultural exchange and mutual understanding between young emerging leaders in the Near East/ South Asia and the United States (U.S.) Grantees receive scholarships to pursue non-degree undergraduate study in the U.S.

Eligibility:

Egyptian students in their first, second, and third year of undergraduate study or final year of secondary school with demonstrated leadership and minimum TOEFL-ITP score of 500.

Iowa International Writer's Program

TechWomen is funded by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), managed by the Institute of International Education (IIE), and implemented in partnership with the Anita Borg Institute for Women in Technology.

Eligibility: emerging women leaders in a technical field with 2-5 years full-time professional experience in a technical field; have, at minimum, a post-secondary degree (Bachelor's or equivalent) and proficient in written and spoken English
